TASK:

- Create a model of an artefact, eg: a costume, building or amulet from the Ancient Egyptian, Greek or Roman cultures. Eg: Egyptian house, ankh amulet, Roman house, senator's toga, Greek house, small statue. These may be from any level of society from Pharaoh or senator down to a poor fisherman, farmer or slave. Submit before 9 am on Monday 27th October 2003.
- Submit a one-page summary describing your researched artefact before 9am on Monday 27th October 2003.
- **3.** Give a TWO minute oral presentation to the class, based on your research for the model to your class in Term 4, Week 3.

FORMAT OF ONE PAGE SUMMARY

Include

- 𝗡 (a) The name of the artefact
- \varkappa (b) The culture the artefact came from.
- \varkappa (c) The time period of the artefact.
- \varkappa (d) The group of people that originally used the artefact.
- 𝒘 (e) What the original artefact was made of.
- ✗ (f) What it was used for.
- \varkappa (g) The source of your information.
- ✗ (h) Your name, your teacher's name and your class.

FORMAT OF YOUR ORAL PRESENTATION

All students must be ready to speak at the beginning of their first History lesson in Term 4 Week 3. The teacher will randomly determine the order in which students will be asked to speak in the lesson.

- Students must speak for a minimum of two (2) minutes and a maximum of three (3) minutes with a bell at 2 minutes 30 seconds.
- ✓ Students are encouraged to display highly developed skills when making their oral presentation. These skills include:
- a) Eye contact
- b) Use of appropriate language
- c) Standing still
- d) Not reading their speech. (Palm cards may be used to queue the speaker)
- e) Speaking slowly, confidently and clearly.
- f) Speaking to time in a coherent and logical manner.
